WATER FOR LIFE

INAUGURATION OF NEW BOREHOLE:

- This year's green energy borehole project was inaugurated in Ngatataek, Kajiado County in Kenya.
- The event was graced by Kajiado County Executive Committee member of water and the Regional Director Br. Musa Ibrahim.
- In attendance were also Representative of Office of the First Lady Kajiado County, District Commissioner, Area Chief, Ngatataek Mosque Committee and community members.
- The project comprises of Solar panels, water pump, water kiosk, 50,000 Litres tank and cattle trough.
- Over 30,000 people are expected to benefit.



INAUGURATION OF WATER WELLS:



- 10 water wells were inaugurated in Uganda. The projects will benefit over 17,000 people.
- Over 3,000 people in Mogadishu, Somalia will benefit from 2 water wells inaugurated at Kulmis and Geele.
- At Camp Khalid in Kismayo, a water well was inaugurated and is expected to benefit over 1,800 people in the camp.
- Over 2,000 people will benefit from a water well project which was inaugurated at Miembe Mingi in Tanzania.

SKILLS DEVELOPMENT AND LIVELIHOOD PROGRAM

INAUGURATION OF NEW CENTER:

- A new center was inaugurated in Malindi coastal Kenya.
- The event was graced by Regional Director Br. Musa Ibrahim.
- In attendance were also Representative from Office of the Deputy Speaker Kilifi County, Representative of Member of Parliament Malindi Constituency and Local area Sheikhs.
- The center offers 3 trainings; ICT, Henna and electronics & mobile phone repair.
- A total of 55 students have been enrolled in the three courses.



TRAINING OF TEACHERS:

- SDLC trainers from the three centers in Nairobi, Madogo and Malindi attended training offered by National Industrial Training Authority (NITA) trainers. The event took place at our Office in Nairobi.
- The training was attended also by HHRD BOD Secretary General Br. Mohamed Ayub Khalid and Regional Director Br. Musa Ibrahim.
- Participants were awarded certificates.



NAIROBI OPEN DAY:

- SDLC Nairobi staff organized a two days event aimed at showcasing some of the hand crafted materials e.g. Flower vase and henna designs done by the students.
- The activity attracted large number of People. Attendees were impressed with the Courses offered at the Centre.
- Trainers registered new students who were interest in joining our centre.

QURAN COMPETITION:

- The event in Nairobi Cluster and Tanzania were graced by The Regional Director and OSP Senior Program Officer.
- A total of 360 Muslim students across all clusters in Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania participated.
- The best 6 students in each cluster were awarded gifts.



SCHOLASTIC MATERIALS AND SCHOOL UNIFORMS DISTRIBUTION:

- 200 new students in Madogo, Isiolo, Mogadishu and Kisarawe clusters received scholastic materials, school uniforms and shoes.
- The materials included HHRD branded bags, stationary and school based shoes.
- The program officer initiated distribution of school uniforms to the new students in Tanzania. The uniforms will help induce presentation skills, which will make the pupils take pride in their appearance.



FOOD DISTRIBUTION:

- A total of 300 students in Kisarawe clusters in Tanzania received food parcels.
- The parcel comprised of flour, rice, cooking oil, beans and sugar.



GUARDIANS' WORKSHOP:



- The theme for the guardians was to explore strategies for improving parenting skills & positive communication.
- This was organized for guardians in Kisarawe (Tanzania), Mogadishu and Kismayo (Somalia).

STUDENTS' WORKSHOP:



- The theme for the students' workshops was building resilience for sustained education performance in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic.
- The activity was successfully carried out for sponsored students in upper primary

EMERGENCY RESPONSE AND DISASTER MANAGEMENT

- Kajiado has been affected by drought that struck Kenya and was announced as National Disaster.
- The distribution was led by the Regional Director Br. Musa Ibrahim and ERDM Senior Program Officer.
- A total of 300 households received food parcels.
