Orphan Support Program

Eid Gifts Distribution: Our team carried out distribution of Eid gifts (clothes and cash) to the 2,600 sponsored orphans. This was a way to put smiles and happiness on their faces during Eid-UI-Fitri celebrations.



School and home Visit: OSP Social organizers across the ten clusters organized regular home and school visits of sponsored orphans to monitor their progress. The team also reported that the students have resumed studies after long holiday.

School of Excellence (SoE): Class 8 students at SoE in Mogadishu, Somalia sat for their final primary education exams during the month. A total of 15 students sat for the exams with results set to be announced later next month.

At the same time OSP Senior Program Officer conducted monitoring visit to the School to see how the children are progressing.



In Kind Gifts Program

In-Kind team in Kenya led by the Senior Program Officer distributed 2 containers of Medical Equipment and Supplies to Mombasa County Government referral hospital. The supplies will serve more than 50,000 people in the county and its environs.



In Somaliland, our team distributed 2 Non-food Items containers to Yemeni Refugees in Hargeisa. The items included clothes, shoes and beddings. Over 20,900 individuals benefitted from the donations.



Water for Life Program

Water for Life's mission is to help communities in need to provide safe and sustainable water source. By combining formal instruction with hands-on training, we teach people how to maintain their own local water resources.



Inauguration: In Kenya, our team inaugurated 7submersible water well pumps in the coastal region.5 in Kilifi and 2 in Likoni. A total of 9,741 people will benefit from the projects.

Meanwhile the team in Tanzania inaugurated 3 hand pump wells in Pwani, Mainland and 5 submersible water pumps which is expected to serve over 13,600 people.



In Somalia, our team inaugurated 1 hand pump well in Kismayo. The well will serve over 1,700 people in the area.

Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH)

This program is geared towards construction and renovation of public latrines in areas with limited reserves and improve hygiene conditions, especially in schools, Hospitals and Social amenities.







Inauguration: Our team members in Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania inaugurated 3 projects in key target locations.

In Kenya, the team inaugurated 1 project at *Ayany* Primary School in Nairobi where 1,200 students are expected to benefit.

The team in Uganda inaugurated 1 latrine project at Milestone Primary School in Butambala where 1,000 students will benefit.

Also, in Tanzania, we inaugurated 1 latrine project at *Sanze* Primary School, the project will benefit over 1,000 students.

The management and students in those learning institutions expressed their gratitude for the initiative. This will contribute to improved hygiene and sanitation.

Skills Development and Livelihood

The program is designed for socio-economic development of people especially women from vulnerable communities. It embodies the approach to eradicate poverty among most neglected segment of the society by providing them with employable skills & facilitation for home based income generating activity.

Our students at Skills Development and Livelihood Centers in Kenya and Somalia are continuing with their learning sessions in ICT, Tailoring & embroidery and Henna & Cooking.
