HHRD in India

HHRD works globally, focusing on countries where most of the population is living below the poverty line. In response to the pandemic, HHRD's partner NGO distributed essentials such as bed sets (including blankets, pillows, and mattresses), food, and basic utensils. Healthcare services were provided to 266,700 people, and seasonal relief, including Ramadan food boxes, were donated to 128,070 individuals. HHRD has successful relief and development programs in India, including seasonal Ramadan activities, poverty alleviation, orphan support, and medical care. With the assistance of local, vetted NGOs, efforts to support the Hyderabad region after flooding included food, water, and hygiene kits, medical aid, and more.

HHRD Status

Since March 2020, HHRD's Covid-19 response has helped over 2.35 million people worldwide with food, hygiene items, and personal protective equipment (PPEs) for frontline workers. HHRD is working in collaboration with other civic partners to combat the situation in India and bring much reprieve to the lives of fellow human beings. HHRD has been working in India with local credible, vetted partner NGOs through Orphan Support, Education Support, Skills Development and Livelihood, Health Care and Nutrition, Emergency Response and Disaster Management, and Seasonal projects. The Covid-19 pandemic has exacerbated the situation for those in need.









Country Context

India is one of the most disaster-prone countries in the world. It is estimated that 60% of the country is vulnerable to earthquakes and 70% to floods. The intensity and frequency of natural disasters have increased in the last decade, often leaving many people in need of humanitarian assistance. Natural hazards are compounded by population growth, urbanization, industrialization, environmental degradation, and climate change. Additionally, persistent gender inequalities, early marriage, and pregnancy contribute to high maternal morbidity and mortality. The massive surge in COVID-19 cases across India lately could further bring catastrophic effects. The number of cases has risen rapidly in recent weeks. The healthcare system in major cities, notably New Delhi, has been severely impacted, with hospitals reporting oxygen shortages and other critical supplies.
