HHRD in Mexico

HHRD works globally, focusing on countries where most of the population lives below the poverty line. HHRD is in Mexico, assisting residents with essentials for everyday use. Our In-Kind Gifts program distributes medical supplies, clothing, food, and bedding to families and individuals. Our Skills Development and Livelihood Program for students teaches self-sufficiency, and Ramadan food boxes provide nourishment to families during the month of fasting. In addition, HHRD continues to give educational support to orphaned children through our Orphan Sponsorship Program.

HHRD Status

HHRD is a registered NGO in the region and has been conducting Seasonal and Emergency Relief projects in and around the city of Chiapas. In addition, HHRD provided extensive emergency relief to those affected by the back-to-back 8.1 and 6.2 earthquakes in 2018. The cities of Oaxaca, Mexico City, Puebla, and Morelos have received food, water, and medicine from HHRD as well.









Country Context

Thousands of asylum seekers attempt to cross Mexico from countries to the south, seeking shelter in the United States. The humanitarian crisis at the US-Mexico border includes separating families and failing to reunite hundreds of minor children with their parents successfully. The United States "Stay in Mexico" program forces refugees to remain in dangerous cities, often without the means to support themselves while they wait for court dates. Mexico has the fourth-highest death toll worldwide from coronavirus, behind the United States, Brazil, and India.
