






We Are Global

In Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh, the Childcare Homes go beyond just education—they offer Rohingya refugees essentials like nourishing foods, hygiene kits, and fun extracurricular activities.


Understanding the unique challenges Syrian refugees face, the program sets up learning centers in deserts to ensure nonschool-going Syrian children don't miss out on education. In areas where schools for Syrian refugees are crowded, extra mobile classrooms are provided.






Children With Disabilities Program


The program is a beacon of hope for vulnerable children facing immense challenges. With an **annual donation of \$720 or \$60 per month**, individuals contribute to the essential rehabilitation and support these children deserve. This funding goes a long way in providing specialized care, educational resources, and necessary therapies tailored to their unique needs.

Mahnoor, faced with weakness in her lower limbs, encountered challenges in performing everyday tasks. Our compassionate team in Nawabshah, Pakistan swiftly registered her, providing regular medical checkups, free physical therapy services, education, and essential nutrition. Mahnoor's remarkable journey includes overcoming hurdles, as she has not only adapted well, but now walks with ease. Engaging in playful activities with other kids, she exudes newfound confidence, a testament to the transformative impact of the support she has received.

Orphan Support Program

HHRD strives to support orphan children and offer them safe and stable sustenance through our Orphan Support Program. This comprehensive program is designed to help innocent orphan children with food, education, healthcare, and psychosocial support.

In 2023, HHRD took a significant step to enhance vital food assistance within the Orphan Support Program on a global level. Starting January 1st, 2024, the monthly contribution for this program has been raised to \$50. The decision to adjust the sponsorship amount was influenced by factors such as rising inflation, high unemployment rates, and the prevailing geopolitical conditions worldwide.

HHRD's Orphan Support Program, spanning 21 countries and three refugee populations, has achieved remarkable milestones. Along with providing food security, healthcare, and education, our integrated approach encompasses leadership camps, career counseling, sports, arts competitions, workshops for guardians and teachers, financial support, and monthly follow-up visits, reflecting our dedication to the holistic development of orphaned children worldwide.

Skills Development and Livelihood Program

Our Skills Development and Livelihood Program (SDLP) offers a range of instructor-led courses to those in need and aims to empower them by either teaching a brand-new skill or polishing an existing one.

The mission is to break the cycle of poverty by providing knowledge and empowering families to overcome challenges and improve their circumstances.

SDLP has successfully established 52 Skills Development Centers and implemented 7 Livelihood Projects, across 21 countries. We expect to expand this program to two more countries by the end of the year, reaching 23 countries in 2024. Our skilled workers were able to produce over 60,000 products such as school bags, uniforms, jewelry, knitted clothes, paintings, resin art, and much more.

More than 1,300 graduates received startup entrepreneur kits, which provide them with the necessary tools to enter the job market or establish their own enterprises.

Pajjani is one of the individuals who has greatly benefited from this program

Mrs. Paijani Rajbansi, a 38-year-old homemaker from Rajgadh Baradashi-3, Jhapa, took on the responsibility of her three family members while enrolling in HHRD Nepal's Optical Dispenser training, located 48 km away in Damak, Jhapa.

Despite the daily three-hour commute, her determination led her to successfully complete the intensive three-month program. After graduation, Mrs. Rajbansi established "Nava Drishti Chasma Pasal" in her small town, employing an ophthalmologist for eye check-ups and crafting optical lenses.

Her shop not only fulfills her dream but also supports her family financially, making her a source of inspiration in her community.

Our Comprehensive Physical Rehabilitation Program (CPRP) offers a range of services to rehabilitate patients physically, mentally, socially, and economically with the aim of making them independent and productive members of society.

The mission is to treat, rehabilitate, educate, and advocate people with congenital or acquired musculoskeletal and neuro-muscular conditions or deformities.


Integrated with our Children with Disabilities Program and Healthcare and Nutrition Program, we are able to provide comprehensive care and improve the quality of life for people in need.

Our projects transformed obstacles into opportunities with:

- Wheelchairs restoring mobility and freedom to the disabled in Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Vietnam, Indonesia, Laos, Jordan, Kenya, Somalia, Tanzania, Uganda, Congo, and Pakistan
- Hearing aids opening up a universe of communication and learning for Syrian and Palestinian refugee children in Jordan
- Prosthetics and Orthotics (Artificial Limbs and Assistive Devices) – enhancing mobility and functionality for those with physical limitations
- Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, and Psychotherapy

10-year old Shareef Ullah's life changed after receiving physiotherapy through CPRP

Diagnosed with Gullian-Barrie Syndrome, Shareef Ullah's parents prayed for a miracle. He was unable to sit or stand independently and eventually became completely confined to bed. After receiving treatment from the Comprehensive Physical Rehabilitation Program's Pediatric Physiotherapy Department in Mansehra, Pakistan, Shareef Ullah began to walk, sit, roll from side to side, and hold objects on his own. He is still continuing treatment for further improvement. Shareef Ullah's parents are grateful to Allah SWT, HHRD, and donors like you, for giving their son a chance at a better life.

Integrated with our Children with Disabilities Program and Comprehensive Physical Rehabilitation Program, we are able to provide complete care and improve the quality of life for people in need.

Samira Ali's prayers were answered when she learned of HANP

A Yemeni Refugee in Hargeisa, Somaliland and the mother of seven children who are all unemployed, Samira's life wasn't easy. She had suffered from cataracts for five years and could not afford surgery. After praying for many years, she was able to have a successful surgery done on her right eye. She was overjoyed to regain clear vision, which has since allowed her to return to work. She is grateful to Allah SWT, HHRD and the donors who made her recovery possible.

Across the world, we respond to evolving situations with in-kind donations, deployment of mobile health clinics and partnerships with other HHRD emergency relief actions.

Our goal is to eliminate the barriers to good health and ensure equitable access to medical resources.



In-Kind Gifts Program

Through our In-Kind Gifts Program, regional teams and our partners sent 157 consignments of essential necessities to people in need around the world in 2023. We served 11 destinations such as Afghanistan, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, Djibouti, Tanzania, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Gaza, and Turkey.

HHRD sends hundreds of containers, filled with generous donations, every year to refugee camps and impoverished communities worldwide. These in-kind gifts have transformed into beacons, radiating hope and relief to communities in distress. Through In-kind gifts, over 2 million individual beneficiaries receive clothing, hygiene items, diapers, food, medical supplies, and much more every year.

In 2023 you helped send boxes of toys, boxes of love, to children in refugee camps and impoverished communities all over the world.

Prime Achievement of 2023: Getting a container to Gaza

On October 7th, 2023, a humanitarian crisis unfolded in Palestine. The event prompted the closure of borders and hindered relief organizations from sending needed emergency aid to Palestinian people for several weeks. Due to the escalating situation in Gaza, hundreds of Palestinians urgently needed medical supplies and aid. The situation worsened with food shortages and scarcity of clean water, resulting in the death of thousands of Palestinians, while even more were struggling to survive with sustained injuries.

In response to this urgent humanitarian crisis, the In-kind Gifts program prepared and successfully sent containers with essential medical supplies and bedding items to Gaza. Despite the challenges, our team remains steadfast in our commitment to providing aid to those in need. Our efforts to send additional consignments to Gaza will persist in the coming days, as we strive to make a meaningful impact and alleviate the suffering of the Palestinian people during these challenging times.



Shelter Relief Program

HHRD's Shelter Relief Program provides modern shelters for those impacted by poverty, war, and disasters across Asia, the Middle East, and North Africa, using local resources to boost economies. In the deserts of Jordan and Lebanon we provide Caravan of Hope Homes and Caravan of Hope Learning Centers for refugees who are living in tents and who do not have access to traditional schools.

This past year saw ambitious projects like creating new homes for displaced Pakistanis after the devastating floods and establishing two new villages in Northern Syria after the earthquake of February 6th. HHRD also built shelters for Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh, and provided weather-resistant housing for impoverished Cambodian families.

Ezzo is someone who is very grateful for HHRD's Shelter Relief Program

Ezzo came to Jordan as a refugee with his wife, four daughters and two sons in 2013. While his children were young, the family of eight were packed inside one tent. However, as the children grew, privacy became a struggle. The tent had to be divided between the men and the women. To make matters more difficult, they did not have a restroom. The public restroom was 15 meters away, making it dangerous at night.

This family was gifted with a Caravan Home with two rooms, a restroom, and a kitchen. Ezzo's daughters have a safe place to stay, with sealed doors and privacy. They do not have to leave their home in the middle of the night to find a restroom.

Water And Sanitation Hygiene Program

Our Water (For Life) And Sanitation Hygiene Program (WASH) is constantly developing and growing to provide water and sanitation systems to refugee and impoverished communities. Through this program, HHRD builds water wells and bathroom units to provide clean water for entire communities.

The WASH program is currently established in 17 countries, implementing 23 varying projects, as needed. These projects include everything from Hygiene Kits to Bio-Sand Filtration Systems. WASH Programs are established to provide a necessity in life and an improved quality of life.


In the heart of Kakamega County, Kenya, Mumias Muslim Primary School faced a paradox — abundant rainfall, yet a dire lack of accessible clean water


Students embarked on long journeys to fetch water, exposing them to health risks and diverting precious time away from their studies. The situation emphasized the critical need for a sustainable solution to ensure access to clean water for the entire school. Determined to overcome this challenge the school community requested HHRD Africa WASH department to help install water tanks.

HHRD teams strategically placed a 10,000-litre rain collection tank across the school compound, utilizing efficient gutter systems to capture and store rainwater.

Today, Mumias Muslim Primary School stands as a symbol of resilience and unity, proving that even in rain-prone regions, challenges can be transformed into opportunities for positive change. The Rainwater Harvesting Project not only quenches the school's water problem but fosters a sense of collective responsibility. This project is benefiting over 1,426 learners and community members at large.

The program is committed to making youth dynamic and conscientious members of society by providing opportunities that help them learn invaluable skills such as communication, critical thinking, problemsolving, leadership, humanitarian assistance, and much more.

Through HHRD's Youth Empowerment Program, students can volunteer with us, cultivate their own projects, and build a sense of connection with our global Ummah.

Young students have pioneered the shipment of In-Kind containers with their schools, helped to fund various projects, and even traveled to directly meet HHRD beneficiaries and work hands-on on specific projects.

Hayyan is an HHRD Youth who has become a part of the global family, working to benefit everyone around him

Hayyan M. began volunteering with the HHRD Houston regional office with his high school Muslim Students Association (MSA). Long after he graduated, his volunteerism did not stop. Hayyan showed up every weekend to sort and pack boxes to send In-Kind containers. He helped the regional office by volunteering for events and eventually becoming Volunteer Lead, organizing entire volunteering events on his own.

It was through his involvement that Hayyan learned about the Youth for Africa and Youth for Jordan trips. He embarked on both. On the Youth for Africa trip, Hayyan helped provide water from water wells, distribute food and play with the children of the community. On the Youth for Jordan trip, Hayyan helped assess the needs of the education facilities, witnessed the deliverance of a restroom unit to the refugee camp, and distributed toys from the current In-Kind shipment.

In Hayyan's words, "HHRD is a second home for me in every way. I can see the parts of my family in need and I can actually do something for them. The duas they make for me... I don't need anything else in the world."

Emergency Relief and Disaster Management

HHRD's Emergency Relief and Disaster Mangement Program plays a pivotal role in responding to global crises in the Middle East, Asia, Africa, Latin America, the Caribbean, the Balkans, and Eastern Europe. We help communities rebuild after disasters, conflicts, and wars.

In 2023, ERDM successfully executed 63 relief projects. Hot meals, food, nonfood items, clothing, hygiene kits, water, medicine, heating materials, shelter, and medical camps benefited 500,774 individuals in 23 countries and refugee populations.

ERDM helped communities rebuild with permanent housing, washrooms, skills development, orphan support, healthcare, nutrition and education support in Pakistan, Afghanistan, Northern Syria, Türkiye, Morocco, Jordan, and Lebanon.

In Afghanistan, Kenya, Jordan, and Nepal, capacitybuilding workshops trained staff and volunteers for more effective disaster responses.

In Pakistan, where the risk of flooding is heightened, community awareness sessions are provided to ensure residents take necessary precautions.

Amidst Turmoil HHRD Provides A Ray of Hope

Abu Islam, his wife, and their children, 9-year-old Islam and 6-year-old Fatima Zahra, resided in a mountainous Atlas Mountains house. With the nearest pharmacy three hours away, Abu Islam struggled to obtain medicine for his ailing son. As night fell, an earthquake struck, causing their house to collapse.

Amid the chaos, Abu Islam could not save Islam, who succumbed to the tragedy. Stranded for hours, they endured the cold until authorities reached them. HHRD emerged as a beacon of compassion, providing mattresses, blankets, food parcels, and personal hygiene items. Acknowledging the trauma, they also brought toys for Fatima Zahra. Abu Islam expressed deep gratitude to HHRD's generous donors and dedicated team for extending a helping hand during their darkest hour, ensuring the family's access to basic necessities.
