
HHRD collaborates with a diverse range of partners, spanning from local community support groups to national alliances, and it extends its network to numerous international connections.

Our comprehensive program provides:

- ESP provides free education for every deserving child by providing full scholarships from elementary to High School.
- ESP also provides partial to full-ride scholarships for deserving students to attain higher professional education.
- Essential School Supplies: We provide backpacks, notebooks, pens, pencils, and other school supplies to help students stay organized and focused in the classroom.
- Financial Assistance: Our stipends and scholarships help alleviate financial burdens, enabling students to concentrate on their studies without worrying about tuition fees or basic necessities.
- Mentoring & Support: Our dedicated staff monitors students' progress, provides guidance, and offers support to families, building a strong partnership between the school, community, and home.
- Holistic Development: We believe in nurturing every aspect of a child's growth. Our program incorporates character-building activities, extracurricular workshops, and community engagement initiatives to promote well-rounded development and a love of learning.

From Orphan to Graduate: Aya Al-Soufi's Inspiring Journey




One of the children benefiting from this program is Maryam

Maryam, a 10-year-old girl, was diagnosed with dysarthria, a neurological disorder affecting speech muscles. Isolated and frustrated, she was unable to attend school. Four months after arriving at the Nangarhar Comprehensive Physical Rehabilitation Centre, where specialists registered her under CWDP and designed a personalized therapy plan.

With daily practice and unwavering family support, Maryam's speech gradually improved. Her words became clearer, boosting her confidence and social interactions. Though she didn't attend school, her parents and therapists provided educational activities at home.

Maryam's perseverance transformed her life. She not only found her voice but also developed new skills, proving that with dedication and support, even the toughest challenges can be overcome. She now inspires others with her journey.

- Health and Well-being: By providing essential healthcare and nutrition, we improve the overall health and well-being of orphaned children.
- Educational Opportunities: Access to quality education empowers children to reach their full potential and break the cycle of poverty.
- Social and Emotional Development: Through social activities and support, children develop essential life skills and build strong relationships.
- Protection and Safety: We ensure children live in a safe and nurturing environment.

In 2024, HHRD took a significant step to enhance vital food assistance within the Orphan Support Program on a global level. Starting January 1st, 2024, the monthly contribution for this program was raised to \$50. The decision to adjust the sponsorship amount was influenced by factors such as rising inflation, high unemployment rates, and the prevailing geopolitical conditions worldwide.

Patrick's Journey: A Future Fueled by Faith and Determination

At 19, Patrick is the third of five siblings living in the Philippines. His family once lived in the remote parts of their province but relocated to the city after his father's passing. His mother, now a single parent, faced the immense challenge of raising five children. With support from relatives and Helping Hand, she ensured they had the opportunities to grow and succeed.

Currently in Grade 12, Patrick is enrolled in the General Academic Strand (GAS). He dreams of becoming either a teacher or a doctor with deep knowledge of Islam. Just recently, he competed in an Islamic Studies Quiz Bee, reaching the finals.

Now an OSP alumnus, Patrick remains actively involved as a youth volunteer, grateful for the opportunities that have shaped his journey.

Skills Development and Livelihood Program

HHRD's Skills Development and Livelihood Program equips individuals facing challenges with the tools they need to achieve financial independence. Through training in artisan skills, financial literacy, and support for product creation and marketing, we empower beneficiaries through:

- Financial Independence: Financial independence empowers individuals to provide for their families and meet their basic needs.
- Economic Stability: By acquiring valuable skills and knowledge, participants can secure stable employment or start their own businesses.
- Community Development: By fostering economic growth and creating job opportunities, our program contributes to the overall development of communities.

SDLP has successfully established 57 Skills Development Centers and implemented 7 Livelihood Projects.

Our skilled workers were able to produce over 70,000 products such as school bags, uniforms, jewelry, knitted clothes, paintings, resin art, and much more.

More than 1,850 graduates received startup entrepreneur kits, which provide them with the necessary tools to enter the job market or establish their own enterprises.

HHRD Empowers Youth with Skills Expo in Kathmandu

In December 2024, HHRD organized a Skills Expo in Kathmandu, Nepal, featuring 18 diverse skill stalls presented by graduates of the Skills Development and Livelihood Program (SDLP). The event served as a platform for students to showcase their products, share their experiences, foster collaboration, and explore opportunities in both local and national markets.

The Skills Expo attracted around 2,000 visitors, primarily young people from various communities. The event also welcomed dozens of government officials, representatives from educational institutions and training centers, as well as employers and entrepreneurs, highlighting its broad appeal and significance.

Comprehensive Physical Rehabilitation Program

HHRD's Comprehensive Physical Rehabilitation Program recognizes the challenges faced by individuals with physical disabilities. Our program provides essential therapies, equipment, and medical services to help people regain mobility and independence.

Services Include:

- Physical Therapy: Our skilled therapists provide tailored exercise programs to strengthen muscles, improve flexibility, and enhance functional abilities.
- Occupational Therapy: We help individuals develop the skills needed for daily living activities, such as dressing, bathing, and cooking.
- Assistive Devices: We provide assistive devices, such as artificial limbs and wheelchairs, to help individuals regain their independence.

Serving: Afghanistan, Countries in Africa, Bangladesh, Jordan, Nepal, Pakistan

Our projects transformed obstacles into opportunities with:

- Wheelchairs restoring mobility and freedom to the disabled in Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Vietnam, Indonesia, Laos, Jordan, Kenya, Somalia, Tanzania, Uganda, Congo, and Pakistan
- Hearing aids opening up a universe of communication and learning for Syrian and Palestinian refugee children in Jordan
- Prosthetics and Orthotics (Artificial Limbs and Assistive Devices) – enhancing mobility and functionality for those with physical limitations
- Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, and Psychotherapy

10-year old Shareef Ullah's life changed after receiving physiotherapy through CPRP

Diagnosed with Gullian-Barrie Syndrome, Shareef Ullah's parents prayed for a miracle. He was unable to sit or stand independently and eventually became completely confined to bed. After receiving treatment from the Comprehensive Physical Rehabilitation Program's Pediatric Physiotherapy Department in Mansehra, Pakistan, Shareef Ullah began to walk, sit, roll from side to side, and hold objects on his own. He is still continuing treatment for further improvement. Shareef Ullah's parents are grateful to Allah SWT, HHRD, and donors like you for giving their son a chance at life.

Healthcare And Nutrition Program

HHRD's Healthcare and Nutrition Program recognizes the importance of accessible and quality healthcare in improving the lives of those in need. Our program offers a comprehensive range of services, including:

- Physical, Mental, and Dental Health Services: We operate medical and dental units to provide healthcare and support to patients.
- Ambulance Services: We provide transportation to hospitals for patients.
- Mother-Child Health Centers: We provide prenatal care, postnatal care, child vaccinations, and family planning services.
- Cataract Surgeries: We conduct free cataract surgeries to restore sight to individuals suffering from blindness.
- Nutritional Support: We implement nutrition programs to address malnutrition, especially among children and pregnant women.

She had suffered from cataracts for five years and could not afford surgery. After praying for many years, she was able to have a successful surgery done on her right eye. She was overjoyed to regain clear vision, which has since allowed her to return to work. She is grateful to Allah SWT, HHRD and the donors who made her recovery possible.


In 2024, you helped benefit 2.5 million people through our In-Kind Gifts Program

Our greatest success was getting containers to Gaza in 2023 and continuing the work in 2024

October 7, 2023, was the beginning of extreme crisis in Palestine. Borders were closed off and organizations were unable to send emergency aid to the people of Palestine for weeks.

Due to the escalating situation in Gaza, hundreds of Palestinians needed medical supplies and aid. Soon there was also a food shortage and a lack of clean water. Thousands were dying, and even more were getting injured. Though HHRD had containers of emergency provisions ready, they were stopped at the Rafah border in Egypt for weeks. The situation felt helpless. However, HHRD persisted in providing aid. We partnered with UNRWA (United Nations Relief and Work Agency) to send 5 containers in 2023 with food, diapers, and water filtration supplies. Soon after, we were able to send 2 more convoys directly into Gaza where live distributions took place.

In a time of disaster and little control, our In-Kind Gifts Program continues to run to provide dire aid wherever it is needed, however it is needed.

HHRD's Water and Sanitation Hygiene Program is constantly developing and growing to provide water and sanitation systems to refugee and impoverished communities. Through this program, HHRD builds water wells and bathroom units to provide clean water for entire communities.

This program recognizes the critical importance of clean water and sanitation for:

- Improved Health: Access to clean water significantly reduces waterborne diseases, leading to improved health outcomes, especially for children and the elderly.
- Economic Empowerment: Reliable access to water supports agriculture and other livelihoods, contributing to economic growth and poverty reduction.
- Environmental Sustainability: By implementing sustainable water management practices, we help protect water resources and prevent water scarcity.

Serving: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, Pakistan, Djibouti, Kenya, Mali, Somalia, Tanzania, Uganda, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Thailand, Gaza, Jordan, Lebanon, and Northern Syria.



Safeguarding Health: Clean Water Solutions in Bangladesh

Mariam Begum manages her household, including caring for her children and elderly parents. Her family had been reliant on a nearby contaminated water source, which frequently led to illnesses and disrupted their daily lives. Medical expenses further strained their limited financial resources. Mariam and her family faced recurring health issues due to unsafe drinking water. The children often missed school, and her elderly parents' health deteriorated because of waterborne diseases. The lack of a clean water source close to their home meant long walks to fetch water that was still unsafe for consumption.

The installation of a deep tube well near Mariam's home has significantly improved her family's quality of life. With access to clean and arsenic-free water, her children are healthier and able to attend school regularly. Her parents' health has also improved, reducing the family's medical expenses and giving them peace of mind.

"This well has transformed our lives. We no longer worry about illnesses caused by dirty water. I feel hopeful for my children's future," Mariam shared with gratitude.

HHRD's Youth Empowerment Program inspires young people to become agents of change. This initiative offers immersive field experiences for youth aged 18-25 with trips to Haiti, Pakistan, Kenya, and Jordan, providing firsthand exposure to humanitarian work. Participants visit refugee camps, interact with beneficiaries, and actively engage in healthcare, relief, and development activities alongside our dedicated staff.

Through HHRD's Youth Empowerment Program, students can volunteer with us, cultivate their own projects, and build a sense of connection with our global Ummah.

Young students have pioneered the shipment of In-Kind containers with their schools, helped to fund various projects, and even traveled to meet direct HHRD beneficiaries and work hands-on on specific projects.

On the Youth for Africa trip Hayyan helped provide water from water wells, distribute food and play with the children of the community. On the Youth for Jordan trip Hayyan helped assess the needs of the education facilities, witnessed the deliverance of a restroom unit to the refugee camp, and distribute toys from the current In-Kind shipment.

In Hayyan's words, "HHRD is a second home for me in every way. I can see the parts of my family in need and I can actually do something for them. The duas they make for me... I don't need anything else in the world."

Gaza Humanitarian Crisis Relief

Since October 7, 2023, Gaza has been facing an unprecedented humanitarian crisis. The devastation is overwhelming, with millions in urgent need of food, water, shelter, and medical assistance. The numbers paint a harrowing picture:

- Lives lost: 46,006, including over 13,000 children
- Injured: 109,274, with approximately 30% being children
- Severe food insecurity: 1.2 million people at risk of starvation
- Destroyed homes: 436,000 housing units damaged or uninhabitable
- Overcrowded shelters: 400–600 people sharing a single toilet
- Schools impacted: 496 of 564 damaged
- Water crisis: Only 98 million liters available daily (far below the 408 million liters required)

With conditions worsening daily, immediate and sustained humanitarian assistance is essential

HHRD's Emergency Relief Efforts

HHRD has been on the ground since 2013, providing essential aid to the people of Gaza. Since the escalation of the crisis, we have mobilized resources to deliver:

- 16 forty-foot containers of aid from the U.S., with 8 already delivered and 8 in progress
- 59 trucks of essential supplies from Jordan, with 56 more planned
- Daily food assistance, including bread, cooked meals, and clean drinking water
- 1,690 tents for displaced families
- 224 sanitation units (toilets and showers) to improve hygiene conditions

These efforts provide immediate relief and bring hope to thousands enduring unimaginable hardships.
