



# Comprehensive Physical Rehabilitation Program

HHRD's Comprehensive Physical Rehabilitation Program recognizes the challenges faced by individuals with physical disabilities. Our program provides essential therapies, equipment, and medical services to help people regain mobility and independence.

## Services Include:

**Physical Therapy:** Our skilled therapists provide tailored exercise programs to strengthen muscles, improve flexibility, and enhance functional abilities.

**Occupational Therapy:** We help individuals develop the skills needed for daily living activities, such as dressing, bathing, and cooking.

**Assistive Devices:** We provide assistive devices, such as artificial limbs and wheelchairs, to help individuals regain their independence.

## Transforming Obstacles into Opportunities

**Wheelchairs** – restoring mobility and freedom to the disabled in Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Vietnam, Indonesia, Laos, Jordan, Kenya, Somalia, Tanzania, Uganda, Congo, and Pakistan

**Hearing aids** – opening up a universe of communication and learning for Syrian and Palestinian refugee children in Jordan

**Prosthetics and Orthotics (Artificial Limbs and Assistive Devices)** – enhancing mobility and functionality for those with physical limitations

**Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, and Psychotherapy**



## Roya Sharmin

Six-year-old Roya Sharmin from Camp-15 in Bangladesh has lived with autism since birth, affecting her physical coordination and ability to move independently. Her condition required continuous support for mobility and care, creating challenges for both Roya and her devoted caregivers.


When HHRD provided Roya with a wheelchair, the impact was immediate and profound. Movement became easier for everyone, reducing the physical strain on her caregivers while increasing Roya's access to essential services. Her overall well-being has improved significantly, and the wheelchair has brought dignity and hope to both Roya and her family in their camp environment.

## Mohamed Abdalla

At just five months old, Mohamed Abdalla from Malindi received a devastating diagnosis: cerebral palsy. His parents, heartbroken by slow progress, stopped hospital visits when he turned three. By age seven, Mohamed couldn't crawl or walk independently.

"We had almost given up hope," his mother admits.

In 2023, Mohamed was referred to HHRD's CWDP Rehabilitation Centre, marking a turning point. Through intensive therapy and unwavering dedication, remarkable changes emerged. After two years of consistent rehabilitation, Mohamed now walks independently—a transformation of his family once thought impossible. "Alhamdulillah, our prayers were answered," they celebrated. Mohamed's journey inspires other families facing similar challenges at the HHRD Rehabilitation Centre.

HHRD's Education Support Program empowers young learners with essential resources, support, and holistic development opportunities. By nurturing both academic and social-emotional development, we ensure every child has the opportunity to thrive and succeed.

## Our Comprehensive Program Provides:

**Essential School Supplies:** Backpacks, notebooks, pens, pencils, and other school supplies.

**Financial Assistance:** Our stipends and scholarships help alleviate financial burdens, enabling students to concentrate on their studies.

**Mentoring & Support:** Our dedicated staff monitors students' progress, provides guidance, and offers support to families.

**Holistic Development:** Our program incorporates character-building activities, extracurricular workshops, and community engagement initiatives to promote well-rounded development and a love of learning.

Serving: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bosnia, Cambodia, Haiti, India, Indonesia, Jordan, Kenya, Laos, Lebanon, Malaysia, Mexico, Nepal, Pakistan, Thailand, and Uganda.



Zahidullah

Zahidullah lost his father at age nine when he was in second grade. Facing financial hardship, he was identified by HHRD and enrolled in the Orphan Support Program, which provided him with educational and material support through Grade 12. He then joined the Education Support Program, receiving further assistance to earn a degree in Medical Technology.

Today, Zahidullah operates a private medical lab in Sheikh Mesri refugee camp, serving orphans, widows, and the local community. He is recognized as a symbol of resilience and success and a perfect example of how HHRD's integrated program structure allows for meaningful support to bright young people around the world.





# Emergency Relief and Disaster Management

HHRD's Emergency Relief and Disaster Management Program plays a vital role in responding swiftly to crises worldwide. Operating across multiple countries, particularly in the Middle East, Asia, and Africa, the program provides urgent assistance to communities affected by natural disasters and conflicts.

In the wake of such emergencies, HHRD delivers essential aid, including:

**Food** to nourish displaced families

**Shelter** to provide safety and protection

**Hygiene** kits to maintain health and sanitation

**Medical support** for urgent healthcare needs

**Supply portable toilets** in situations where infrastructure has been destroyed.

By offering immediate and targeted assistance, the program serves as a crucial lifeline for those facing unimaginable hardships. HHRD continues to be a beacon of hope, bringing relief and resilience to communities in their most challenging moments.



## Hope for Sudanese Refugees in Kenya and Uganda


The food distribution initiative for Sudanese refugee families was not only necessary for immediate relief but also a crucial step toward ensuring food security in a region where alternative sources of sustenance are extremely limited.

"This food means my children will not sleep hungry. I don't have to worry about where the next meal will come from," Amina Ibrahim, a 34-year-old Sudanese mother of four, said with gratitude. For the first time in months, she prepared a full meal, watching her children eat to their satisfaction. The joy and comfort this simple act brought her were immeasurable. This intervention alleviated immediate hunger, reducing the stress and uncertainty many families face when securing their next meal.

# Gaza Humanitarian Crisis Relief

Since October 7, 2023, Gaza has been facing an unprecedented humanitarian crisis. The devastation is overwhelming, with millions in urgent need of food, water, shelter, and medical assistance.

## HHRD's Emergency Relief Efforts

HHRD has been on the ground since 2013, providing essential aid to the people of Gaza. Since the escalation of the crisis, we have mobilized resources to deliver:

- **129 Trucks:** 100 sent from Jordan, 7 sent from Egypt, 22 in progress.
- **40,000 Food Items:** food packages & pallets, flour bags and qurbani (sheep & cows).
- **20,000 Winter Relief Items:** clothes, winter wool kits, blankets and sleeping bags.
- **2,600+ Shelter Support:** tents, tent covers, multi purpose centers and mobile homes.
- **5,500+ Sanitation Support:** washrooms & hygiene kits.
- **20,000 Various Medications**
- **570,000+ Hot Meals:** about 2,000+ daily hot meals
- **33.5 million+ Liter Drinking Water:** about 128,000 liters daily.
- 1.1 million+ Bread Loaves.

These efforts provide immediate relief and bring hope to thousands enduring unimaginable hardships.



## The Numbers Paint a Harrowing Picture:

- **Lives lost:**  
46,006, including over 13,000 children
- **Injured:**  
109,274, with approximately 30% being children
- **Severe food insecurity:**  
1.2 million people at risk of starvation
- **Destroyed homes:**  
436,000 housing units damaged or uninhabitable
- **Overcrowded shelters:**  
400–600 people sharing a single toilet
- **Schools impacted:**  
496 of 564 damaged
- **Water crisis:**  
Only 98 million liters available daily  
(far below the 408 million liters required)

With conditions worsening daily, immediate and sustained humanitarian assistance is essential.

# Healthcare and Nutrition Program

HHRD's Healthcare and Nutrition Program recognizes the importance of accessible and quality healthcare in improving the lives of those in need.

## Comprehensive Range of Services:

- **Physical, Mental, and Dental Health Services:** We operate medical and dental units to provide healthcare and support to patients.
- **Ambulance Services:** We provide transportation to hospitals for patients.
- **Mother-Child Health Centers:** We provide prenatal care, postnatal care, child vaccinations, and family planning services.
- **Cataract Surgeries:** We conduct free cataract surgeries to restore sight to individuals suffering from blindness.
- **Nutritional Support:** We implement nutrition programs to address malnutrition, especially among children and pregnant women.

Serving: Pakistan, Nepal, Afghanistan, Jordan, Morocco, Gaza, Lebanon, Bangladesh, Africa

## Our projects included:

- Medical Camps and Mobile Health and Dental Services - emergency care for devastated communities, rural areas, and refugee camps
- 9,414+ successful cataract surgeries - restoring eyesight and independence
- Rapid Response Units and Ambulances - ensuring emergency relief and safe transportation
- Mother & Child Healthcare and Nutrition Centers - providing quality ante-natal, post-natal, and neo-natal care, along with immunization and nutritional services



## Mobile Clinics in Afghanistan Bring Healthcare to the People

Usman, a hardworking 12th-grade student from Kunar Province, suffered from a dislocated ankle joint that made his daily walk to school painful and slow. He frequently arrived late or missed classes entirely due to the pain, struggling academically despite his intelligence while his worried mother searched for help.

"Tomorrow the HHRD Mobile Family Clinic comes—Inshallah, they can help you," his mother assured him.

HHRD's Mobile Family Clinic provided immediate care when they visited his area, examining Usman and providing medication for pain and swelling. He was referred to an advanced orthopedic center for comprehensive treatment, including ankle support tools that gradually reduced his discomfort. Within days, Usman's condition improved significantly, allowing him to attend school regularly and live without constant pain. "I am deeply grateful—may God bless all those who helped me," Usman expressed with heartfelt thanks.

## In-Kind Gifts Program

HHRD's In-Kind Gifts Program collects essential items from donors and distributes them to hospitals, schools, and individuals worldwide. This program helps communities recover from disasters and addresses poverty.

### Improving Overall Well-Being by Providing:

**Basic Needs:** We ensure families have essentials such as food, clothes, shoes, and more to live with dignity.

**Healthcare Needs:** By providing medical supplies and equipment, we support healthcare facilities in delivering quality care to patients.

**Educational Needs:** We contribute to the education of children by providing essential learning materials and school supplies.

**School Furniture:** We help create safe and supportive learning environments by providing essential classroom furniture, which allows children to study comfortably and focus on their education without physical barriers.



### "Mobile Mall of Humanity"

When the 2025 floods displaced thousands across Pakistan, many families were left without clothing, bedding, or safe drinking water and with no way to travel long distances for help. To meet this urgent need, HHRD's In-Kind Gifts Program (IKGP) Pakistan launched the Mobile Mall of Humanity, a compassionate "Mall on Wheels" that brought essential aid directly to people's doorsteps.

The impact was profound. Doorstep delivery reduced stress, protected vulnerable family members, and ensured access to clean water. Most importantly, families shared that this support made them feel "seen and cared for" at a time of deep loss.

The Mobile Mall of Humanity demonstrated that emergency relief can be both efficient and deeply human. Through this innovative approach, IKGP Pakistan brought comfort, dignity, and hope to thousands of flood-affected families



SDLP has successfully established 63 Skills Development Centers and implemented 7 Livelihood Projects.

Our skilled workers were able to produce over 70,000 products such as school bags, uniforms, jewelry, knitted clothes, paintings, resin art, and much more.

More than 1,750 graduates received startup entrepreneur kits, which provide them with the necessary tools to enter the job market or establish their own enterprises.



## HHRD Empowers Women Entrepreneurs

Jamila Njeri Ali, second of three siblings, faced financial constraints after high school that prevented university enrollment. When she discovered SDLC, understanding teachers accommodated her family's challenges, and her mother contributed small amounts toward fees and equipment.

Throughout her training, she gained invaluable experience through Friday sales at SDLC, enhancing communication skills and customer interaction. Upon completion, she received a business start-up kit providing steady income. Her baking venture now supports her family while building toward future goals. "I'm incredibly grateful and deeply obligated for these life-changing opportunities," Jamila expresses. Through flexible programs and practical training, HHRD transforms dreams into sustainable livelihoods, one pastry at a time.

Provides essential food items to families in need during the holy month of Ramadan, ensuring they can observe their fast with dignity and strength.


### Qurbani/Udhiya Program

Serving: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Gaza, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Pakistan, and Syria.




## In Gaza, A Community Center Means Hope

In a northern Gaza displacement camp, 16-year-old Ahmed lost his home and school in the conflict. Living in a tent with little comfort, he scavenged to help his family and felt hopeless about the future. In June 2025, HHRD constructed a new community center with space for educational programs, recreation and prayer. Enrolling in 21st Century Skills training, Ahmed learned teamwork, creative thinking, and cross-cultural communication between Arabic and English-speaking communities. In 2025, you helped provide a secure home for **8,215 people**





## Empowering Women Through Accessible Water

Eight-year-old Amina from Nangarhar had to wake up very early each morning to walk long distances with her mother and sister searching for water. Often the water was dirty, sometimes they found nothing at all, and Amina frequently missed school days, exhausted from the daily struggle. Her little brother fell sick from contaminated water.

"Before, everything was difficult. But now... everything is different," Amina reflects.

HHRD's Water for Life Project brought clean water directly to Amina's village through a new hand pump, transforming daily life for her entire community. Now, Amina gets to school on time because with water available in the village, she doesn't have to walk so far. Her brother no longer suffers from waterborne illness, and her family has found peace. Serving communities across Nangarhar, HHRD continues providing safe water access to those in need. "Because of you, I can smile. I can learn. And I can dream big," says Amina with joy.

This initiative offers immersive field experiences for youth aged 18-25 with trips to Haiti, Pakistan, Kenya, and Jordan, providing firsthand exposure to humanitarian work. Participants visit refugee camps, interact with beneficiaries, and actively engage in healthcare, relief, and development activities alongside our dedicated staff.
